



- High forest cover
 and low
 deforestation rate
- Significant carbon stocks



• Deforestation in Peru





- > 80% of deforestation takes
 place on < 5 ha/year polygons
 (>40% below 1ha/year)
- > 80 % in non-agricultural lands assigned to forest use
- > 46 % of deforestation on lands with unclear legal status and assignment of territorial rights


Insights from the outset


- Insufficient coordination in the country and need for an inter-sectorial and inclusive approach
- Public plans, public entities and different levels of the government have not sufficiently incorporated activities to reduce deforestation
- No coordination among cooperation offers from donors and international programs


Financing and cooperation channels












REDD+ stages, ongoing processes and project support

Lessons, good practice and challenges

- Alignment of finance is only possible when REDD+ support is coordinated
- Mapping the different aspects addressed by different cooperation offers helps to map gaps in existing finance and target asks
- Strategy! → align support to national priorities
- Key role of central authority that leads in terms of strategy and coordinating cooperation
