Forests under the UNFCCC and COP30

Forests under the Convention & Paris Agreement

Article 4.1 (d): Promote sustainable management, and promote and cooperate in the conservation and enhancement, as appropriate, of sinks and reservoirs of all greenhouse gases not controlled by the Montreal Protocol, including biomass, forests and oceans as well as other terrestrial, coastal and marine ecosystems.

Convention

Article 5.1: Refer back to 4.1 (d) of the Convention.

Article 5.2: Parties are encouraged to take action to implement and support, including through results-based payments, the existing framework as set out in related guidance and decisions already agreed under the Convention for REDD+.

Paris Agreement



Forests & First GST

As a result of extended negotiations, the Parties finally agreed on the first Global Stocktake at COP28. This covers the full scope of climate issues, including fossil fuels, transportation and nature.

- 33. Further emphasizes the importance of conserving, protecting and restoring nature and ecosystems towards achieving the Paris Agreement temperature goal, including through enhanced efforts towards halting and reversing deforestation and forest degradation by 2030, and other terrestrial and marine ecosystems acting as sinks and reservoirs of greenhouse gases and by conserving biodiversity, while ensuring social and environmental safeguards, in line with the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework;
- 34. Notes the need for enhanced support and investment, including through financial resources, technology transfer and capacity-building, for efforts towards halting and reversing deforestation and forest degradation by 2030 in the context of sustainable development and poverty eradication, in accordance with Article 5 of the Paris Agreement, including through results-based payments for policy approaches and positive incentives for activities relating to reducing emissions from deforestation and forest degradation, and the role of conservation, sustainable management of forests and enhancement of forest carbon stocks in developing countries; and alternative policy approaches, such as joint mitigation and adaptation approaches for the integral and sustainable management of forests, while reaffirming the importance of incentivizing, as appropriate, non-carbon benefits associated with such approaches;


Warsaw Framework for REDD+

Reduce Emissions from Deforestation and forest Degradation in developing countries

Holistic framework for climate action in the forest sector established in 2013. Developing countries can receive results-based payments (RBP) for emission reductions and enhancement of removals through the implementation of REDD+ activities:

- Reducing emissions from deforestation
- Reducing emissions from forest degradation
- Enhancement of forest carbon stocks
- Conservation of forest carbon stocks
- Sustainable management of forests

Key developments in REDD+

40th GCF meeting (October 2024)

- The GCF Board adopted a proposal (GCF/B.40/11) for a landmark policy integrating REDD+ RBP into the Fund's regular project activity cycle.
- The policy is fully aligned with the Warsaw Framework for REDD+.
- To apply for the funding, countries need to have the framework referred to in A5.2 of the PA fully in place.

Article 6.4 Supervisory Body

- Adopted Methodologies Standard (A6.4-STAN-METH-001) and standard for addressing leakage (A6.4-STAN-METH-005).
- They indicate requirements for A6.4 activities that fall under the scope of REDD+.
- Project-level REDD+ activities must be included in the host country's national REDD+ strategy.






Long-term implementation of national REDD+



Biennial Transparency Report

- As of 15 April 2025, 101 Parties submitted their first BTRs.
- 6 Parties submitted REDD+ technical annex as part of their BTRs, reporting a total of about 285 Mt CO2/eq in emission reductions from REDD+ activities.
- BTR Synthesis Report is available (https://unfccc.int/documents/651012).
- 68 Parties included PaMs related to sustainable management of forest, the highest number among forest-related PaMs.
- A total of 150 PaMs related to sustainable management of forest were identified across 101 BTRs.





NDCs 3.0

• NDC synthesis report 2025 is published, covering updated 64 NDCs (https://unfccc.int/documents/650664).

Key messages on forests

International
collaboration and
REDD+ results-based
payments are
highlighted as **key to mitigation** in the forest
sector.

More Parties than previously included in their NDCs a broader range of forest actions, covering REDD+ activities.

Funding gaps remain, with Parties stressing that predictable finance, including REDD+ results-based payments, is essential for turning ambition into outcomes.



More than a decade after the adoption of the Warsaw Framework for REDD+, the landscape of REDD+ implementation is becoming increasingly complex...




What we have now: REDD+ Discussion Forum

What we have now: REDD+ reviews

Technical assessment of proposed FRELs/FRLs and technical analysis of REDD+ results is a good opportunity to have direct interaction between experts and REDD+ countries.

What are the benefits of REDD+ review?

REDD+ review processes
enhance country's capacity
to report GHG emissions
and removals in the forest
sector, helping to build trust
and enabling them to track
progress towards
achieving NDCs.

Using the insights gained from the REDD+ review, countries increase their domestic long-term capacity to gather and analyze data, which in turn helps to inform policy decisions and implement more ambitious climate action in the forest sector.

REDD+ meeting

Regional meeting

Planning one regional REDD+ expert meeting per year to deepen the understanding of key issues and promote South-South exchange among experts.



Global meeting

Holding one global meeting every two years, bringing together REDD+ experts from all regions, key donors and observer organizations for open and inclusive exchange.
